### Part I 3 PM NH Rebellion Take \$ out of Politics



Come meet **Jeff McLean, Director of the NH Rebellion**, who will talk about the movement and address [Article #23 “Get Big Money out of Politics”](#), which will appear on our March 10<sup>th</sup> ballot. The New Hampshire Rebellion is a cross-partisan movement of citizens committed to making the corruption of money in politics the central issue in the 2016 presidential election.

This movement is motivated by one unavoidable fact: It is impossible in America to make meaningful progress on the major issues of our day until we address the system of corruption that has infected our government. Private money from special interests compromises our elected officials, intensifies government dysfunction, and undermines representative democracy in Washington.

Based in Manchester, New Hampshire, the NH Rebellion is part of [Open Democracy](#) and works closely with reform-minded individuals and groups on both the Right and Left to stop the corrupting influence of special interest money in politics.

### Part II 4 PM Trash Talk Article #25 Keep \$ from going out with the Trash

#### Trash Talk Article #25

Learn how we, as residents of Rye, can keep our MONEY and resources out of the landfill.



**Sarah Bernier from Waste Zero** will be addressing the **SMART/PAYT** program as proposed with Article #25 in the upcoming election. PAYT would lower our trash output and increase our recycling by metering trash just like other utilities such as electricity – YOU pay for what YOU USE. This program, if passed in Rye, is expected to reduce the trash we send to the landfill by 500 tons per year which is roughly one load per week. When trash is reduced so are the related costs to manage that trash. Learn why the Rye Recycling Education Committee recommends this program and believes that PAYT is the equitable, economical and environmentally sustainable solution.



**Rian Bedard from Mr. Fox Composting** will answer your questions about the “Food Waste Collection Program” which will soon be opened up to all – affording all residents of Rye the opportunity to significantly decrease the volume of “trash” their households generate.

To date, since beginning in 2009, Mr. Fox Composting has diverted over 7 Million pounds of food-waste that otherwise would have gone to the landfill. Mr. Fox believes food waste shouldn't go to the landfill and that the future of the planet is dependent on the majority of us changing small habits.
