Delivered to **Grantee** the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, have given, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, ensoff, convey and confirm unto the said **Grantee** its successors and assigns forever, A certain parcel of land in said Rye, bounded on the North by wood land of the 34 acre of Joseph Garland, one hundred and fifty-six feet; on the East by wood land of said heirs, one hundred and ninety-two feet; on the South by the New Lane highway sometimes called the Crown Road, two hundred and forty feet; on the West by field land of Sidney L. Jernine, three hundred and forty-four feet, containing one and six one-hundredths acres.

As soon as the gravel on the lot here conveyed is exhausted by said Town, the lot here conveyed shall revert to, and become the property of the grantees herein, their heirs and assigns.

To have and to hold the said granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances to the same belonging to it the said **grantee** and its successors and heirs and assigns, to and their only proper use and benefit forever. And we each of us do hereby release, discharge and waive all such rights of exception from attachment and levy or sale on execution, and such other rights whatsoever in said premises, and in each had every part thereof, as only family Homestead, as are exempted by the Homestead of Families from attachment and levy or legal execution, or by any other Statute or Statutes of said State.
