New FEMA Flood Maps impact Home Owners - Effective January 29th

What do the new FEMA maps mean to Rye Residents?

- 1) If you are in or near a Flood area it is suggested to review your insurance coverage with your Insurance agent before Friday.
- **2)** Expansion of the zones mean that more properties will be subject to building requirements when requesting any building permits.

Flood Hazard Maps: Click Here Tips on using the maps from the RCL:

- 1. Click OK, Close the welcome screen
- 2. Select "Pending FEMA Flood Hazard Data" and "Roads and Bridges" on the left panel. To increase legibility one might uncheck "Tax Map Parcel Boundaries". It can always be turned back on
- 3. Search for your address in the box top left on the map
- 4. Zoom in and out as needed to see zones.
- 5. Non shaded zones are X "Minimal Flood Hazard" as are the Brown zones which have 0.2% chance of annual flooding
- 6. Most impacted by changes are the Blue zones A, AE, AO, V or VE "Special Flood Hazard Zones" with 1% annual chance of flooding
