In an effort to reduce pollution entering the waterways and ocean, the main project will include an approximately 4-mile sewer line from the North Hampton town line through Rye and connecting with Portsmouth. Funds would be used for design and construction of this sewer line, and assist with making the needed connections.

For decades, we have had pollution entering the ocean from failed septic systems along the coast and Route One. Concurrent with the sewer line will be a water line to service the same area, as municipal water service is not available in this area, at this time. The water issue is directly connected to the situations above as they are on private wells and the Coakley pollution plume is suspected to be spreading in the northeasterly direction towards the concerned area. Conventional septic systems are a constant threat to the wells. A modern sewer system will greatly reduce the potential contamination. The super fund site, Coakley Land Fill is in close proximity and there is evidence that the pollutants (heavy metals, FOCs and PFAS) contained there are beginning to affect the surrounding drinking water supplies. Recently water tested at the adjacent Berry's Brook has shown levels dangerous to humans, both on the surface and in the ground water samples. Because there are no sewer lines to this area, future developments are designed to accommodate septic systems. In order to mediate this potential ecological disaster, the Town of Rye, has previously voted to allow a sewer extension from Portsmouth to Rye, however we have not had funding to accomplish this needed system.

Rye is a small town geographically with a total of 35.5 square miles, most of which is wet land or marsh (22.9 Sq. mi). To a large extent the land bordered by the beaches have been developed and now there are plans to develop the westerly side of the town adjacent to Route 1, abutting Portsmouth to the north and Greenland to the west. Most of this land is in the wellhead or aqua protection zones. In effect, all water that falls or is allowed to permeate the earth in this area will end up in the drinking water supply or the ocean.

16. Project Goals and Results: *

Our goal is to supply the Route 1 corridor with a modern effective sewer system and potable water supply that will greatly enhance the quality of life, protect the environment and help to soften the impact of the pollution source now in existence and get ahead of the one that is threatening. It has long been known that the Coakley land fill has been an environmental nightmare. It is now under the jurisdiction of the EPA and being watched to evaluate the impact to the ground water and adjacent wells. While this is a clear and present danger to our water resources, another situation has surfaced to potentially exacerbate the situation. The national housing boom has reached the Route 1 corridor from North Hampton to the Portsmouth town line. Potentially there can be 120+housing units built along a 3-4 mile stretch; some of which will be work force housing. The issue is these units will be built with conventional septic systems unless municipal sewer is provided in a timely manner. The area in question is not capable of absorbing the volume of waste that is projected. In fact, some existing systems have failed and are under orders to repair or replace at once. While Coakley is being observed, it is critical that we embark on the sewer project before it is too late. Rye simply does not have the financial resources to take on a project such as this without federal help.

A modern sewer system would protect one of Rye's most valuable resources; water as well as protecting the environmental integrity of the Seacoast area. The installation of sewer along the Route 1 corridor will not only insure that residents in this area have access to clean drinking water but it will also have the benefit of helping protect the environment from over saturation of septic in an area that cannot absorb the volume of waste that is projected. Tourism will also increase when we can remove signs from our beaches warning tourists of the high bacteria counts there, which is believed to be directly associated to a large degree with failed septic systems.


