order to enhance transparency and financial accountability in the operation of Town government, the voters of the Town of Rye adopt this Ordinance.

Section of Litigation

The Select Board of the Town of Rye, or any Commission or Committee whose members are not elected but are appointed exclusively by the Select Board, deems it necessary or desirable to initiate litigation against any party or to undertake an appeal to any State or Federal administrative agency or council, the Select Board shall, prior to initiation of any such litigation or appeal:

- Conduct a Public Hearing at which the Select Board shall describe the need for, anticipated costs of, estimated duration of and likely outcome of such litigation or appeal; and
- After the conclusion of said Public Hearing, vote to proceed or not to proceed with such litigation or appeal.

Funds shall be expended for any such litigation or appeal until the Select Board has voted to proceed with such litigation or appeal, following the Public Hearing.

Section of Litigation

litigation is commenced against the Town of Rye, or any Commission or Committee whose members are not elected but are appointed exclusively by the Select Board, the Select Board shall, within 30 days following the commencement of such litigation:

- Conduct a Public Hearing at which the Select Board shall describe the reasons why such litigation has been commenced, anticipated costs of, estimated duration of and likely outcome of such litigation and whether, and to what extent, the costs will be covered by insurance; and
- Describe what measures can be taken to minimize the cost of such litigation and to effect a resolution at the earliest reasonable date.

Annual Reporting

between November first and December first of each year the Select Board shall conduct a Public Hearing and report on the status of all litigation and appeals in which the Town has been engaged during the year and the costs . . . expenses associated therewith. As to each litigation or appeal, the Select Board shall vote to continue or end such litigation or appeal.
