
Technology Board Report August 2024

- 1. Frontline Time and Attendance Implementation
 - a. Pilot group using the Time and Attendance to track hourly employees
 - b. Meet weekly with the financial team and frontline implementation specialist to facilitate the project.
 - c. The system is ready for all hourly employees to begin using at the start of the 2024-2025 school year (Hooray!!!!)
 - d. Part 2 of this project begins August 20th with the integration of Frontline with Tyler to streamline the payroll process.



- 2. Frontline Absence Management Rollover
 - a. Balances updated for 2024-2025 school year
 - b. Ready for use
- 3. Frontline Central / Recruiting and Hiring
 - a. All new hires went through Recuriting and Hiring Module, then pulled into Frontline Central
 - b. All new hire paperwork was eliminated and all forms and documents were completed paperlessly, using Frontline Central.
 - c. Improved tracking, visibility, accuracy, and reduced manual labor for Jodi Wick in HR of new hire information.
 - d. Staging the work to send contracts for 2025-2026 using Frontline Central

4. SAU

a. Storage Upgrade

- i. Added 40 TB of storage to our SAU Datacenter.
- ii. Increased storage capacity for backups and on-site servers



5. NPS

- a. Consolidation of student ipads.
 - i. Retired 5th, 6th, 7th generation devices no longer capable of upgrades
 - ii. Consolidated 8th & 9th generation devices into Grades K, 1, 2.
 - iii. Erased, Updated, and re-assigned to students.

ii. Bode was happy to help!




6. MHT

7. GCS


- a. Network Switching Upgrade

 - 2. Eliminated IP Speakers Echo eliminated.




- c. Network Rewire

Here is an update on the progress of this massive network overhaul. Last week was dedicated to removing years of old cabling, followed by relocating and securing network racks in each floor's closet. New fiber optic cable has been installed and spliced, providing a High-speed network backbone between the floors. The lower level and 2nd Floor both have new cabling roughed in, and work will begin on the main floor tomorrow. With Mosley, the sheepadoodle's help, Mr. Cooney and I have started to reassemble the switching and hardware in each closet. I would anticipate at least another week before we might have some semblance of internet connectivity in the building.

At the same time, we have been installing the Newline Boards in each classroom.

The team from Connectivity Point has been working hard and is doing a wonderful job of building a state-of-the-art network. So far they have installed over 10,000 feet of new network cabling!"
