

**CIP Related Petitioned Warrant Articles**

**2013:**

This Article was so that the Select Board would update the CIP each year, it had not been completed for over five or more years before this.

<p><b>ARTICLE 21. (By Petition)</b> Shall the Town enhance the usefulness of the Capital Improvements Program ("CIP") process by conducting a public hearing each year, pursuant to RSA 675:6, prior to the adoption by the CIP Committee of the CIP Plan? The capital budget shall encompass all entities within the Town that are required to submit capital projects to the CIP Committee. Any building, land acquisition, or other capital project which is proposed should be accompanied by a listing of sources of funds likely to be needed to implement such a project, e.g. gifts, revenues, taxes, etc. A table shall be provided showing how the total capital investment each year will affect the tax rate, using clearly set forth assumptions as to financing methods that are consistent with past Town practices for each type of project.
